The Marching Warriors

The legacy of the Marching Warriors will continue to be one of the brightest jewels of Warrior Nation! Students in The Marching Warriors will earn a Varsity Letter after completing two years in the prestigious ensemble. The ensemble will include students currently in grades 6-11 at Warren Middle and High School who are accepted after the Play-In and March-In in the Spring of 2020. Students will be accepted based upon their performance abilities and their likelihood of success with the demands of the ensemble.

Below you can see the strenuous demands of The Marching Warriors in 2020. Beginning in the Spring, students will be asked to attend a number of training sessions and summer mini-camps before the band camps even arrive. Students selected* to the Marching Warriors will not only fulfill the responsibilities of OMEA and BOA competitions, but will also be a part of the Big Blue Machine on Friday nights and in local parades. *Participating musicians are expected to be enrolled in a Middle School Band or the Warren Symphonic Band for at least the first semester.*

The Marching Warriors will operate on less rehearsal time and heightened expectations. Students selected for this ensemble must be able to make a commitment from July through the first half of November (Bands of America Grand Nationals). Attendance will be a major key to success with



fewer rehearsals to learn, clean, and polish the competitive program.

Students who wish to perform with The Marching Warriors will need to complete a Play-In/March-In during the end of March and beginning of April. Students will be notified of his or her placement in either or both bands soon afterward.

...and the Big Blue Machine

The birth of the Big Blue Machine opens the door for a wide variety of students including athletes, new musicians, and to developing players. What better way is there to learn than by doing? Students participating in the Big Blue Machine will have a much lighter commitment of rehearsal time during the summer and school year but will still perform at all of the football games and local parades. You read that right - all of those performances with the commitment of just one day of rehearsal each week! This is truly an opportunity for any student* to pick up an instrument and get the experience of a school marching band without the pressures of performing at the high level of a competitive ensemble. The ensemble will also include every member of The Marching Warriors.

In the chart below you can see the commitments for the Big Blue Machine. With only one rehearsal each week, it is imperative that members maintain a stellar attendance record from Band Camp through the duration of the football season. All musicians in the ensemble should make every effort to enroll in a Middle School Band or the Warren Symphonic Band for <u>at least</u> the first semester.

This new era will provide two performance environments which better allow for individual students to experience a higher level of success. The higher demand of The Marching Warriors will require deeper level of commitments and abilities while the Big Blue Machine will allow for all interested students to have a great time and present quality performances again and again to our community at football games, parades and school assemblies.

Why Now?

To think that this was a decision made over a cup of coffee last week would be a massive error! This decision, although it is taking effect now, has been developing for more than two years. We have seen an increased level of participation from the younger grades with smaller numbers in the upper classes, and it is clear that a disconnect is developing between the Director's desire for more involvement and the demand placed on young developing members to perform at a highly competitive level.

The performing arts should be a wonderful part of every young student's life and success at the personal level should be a focus for all teachers of music and the arts. Young students who are thrust into an environment for which they are not ready can bring about frustration, feelings of apathy, or at its worst - a strong desire to drop out. None of these feelings or results are good for the student, for his/her peers or for the ensemble.

As the number of young members has increased in the past two years, the success of the whole ensemble has become somewhat stagnant. It would be remiss to not mention that the level of performance has remained well above average at Warren. However, the steady climb The Marching Warriors had experienced in 2016 and 2017 has stalled ever since. The correlation is much more than a coincidence and one that <u>can</u> be corrected with careful planning and effort.

So, now is the time for the change. Now is the time to bring the Marching Warriors into a new decade of success and tradition.

2020 Marching Warriors Play-In & March-In

Students who wish to march on the field with The Marching Warriors in 2020 and who would like to play a woodwind or brass instrument must complete a short and low-pressure Play-In & March-In. The purpose of the Play-In & March-In is to verify the readiness and suitability of the individual student based upon three factors: the playing level of the student, the physical capability of the student, and the social preparedness of the student's behavior for a competitive marching ensemble. No single factor will be the sole reason for a student's acceptance or rejection from The Marching Warriors. After completing the Play-In & March-In, accepted students will be notified of their offered position in The Marching Warriors while all other students will granted a spot in the *Big Blue Machine* - an exciting new ensemble open to all students no matter the experience!

Students who wish to march with the Color Guard or a Percussion section will be subject to a separate audition process. Students who wish only to perform in the **Big Blue Machine** are <u>not</u> required to Play-In or March-In.

Play-In

Any, some, or all of the following:

Concert F Remington Exercise (half or whole notes)

Concert Bb Major Scale (ascending and descending)

Concert Eb Major Scale (ascending and descending)

Concert Ab Major Scale (ascending and descending)

All scales may be requested at various rhythms and speeds.

March-In

Any, some, or all of the following:

Call to Attention. Call to Parade Rest.

Forward 4 - Halt. Backward 4 - Halt.

Forward 8 - Backward 8 - Halt.

Lateral slide 8 - Halt.

All movements may be requested while playing long tones.
